

The Summer Beanie

Crochet Pattern

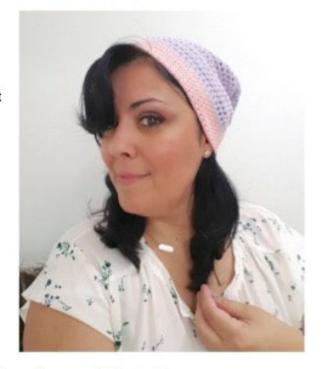

Meterials

- Hook: 4.5 mm
- Yarn: Light weight 3 or Fine weight 2
 (Truboo by Lion Brand was used to crochet the beanie pictured.) *Approx 120 150g.
- Scissors
- Yarn Needle

Stitch Legend

- Rnd round
- st(s) stitch(es)
- ch(s) chains(s)
- sl st slip stitch
- SC single crochet
- DC double crochet
- * repeat



* The hat in this pattern is for an adult. For other sizes, please see sizing chart here: http://www.crochetcrafty.com/pdf/Crochet-Hat-Sizing-Chart.pdf The main measurement you want to focus on is the head circumference to achieve the slouchy look. Length of this beanie is 9.5* or 23cm without the brim

Pattern

Begin with a slip knot on your hook and ch 4 to begin. Then sl st into the first ch to create a ring. (You can chain 5 if you find the ch 4 too tight to work into.)

*A note here: Even though we are working in the round, it's recommended that you turn your work with each round so as to keep the seam line straight. With the mesh stitch, it will almost disappear which is ideal for a nicely streamlined look.

Rnd - 1

- Ch 4, (this will count as a DC, ch 1) then place 1DC into the ring, ch 1
- Continue placing (1 DC, ch1) into the ring until you have a total of 10 (DC, ch1) segments
- sl st to the top of the 3rd ch and turn your work

You will have a **total of 10 DC sts** at the end of this round (For this project I will not be counting the ch sts.)

Rnd - 2

- sl st into the first space and ch 4, then into the next space place 1 DC, ch 1, 1 DC
- ch 1 and repeat *(1DC, ch 1, 1 DC) until you have a total of 20 DC
 - SI st to the top of the 3rd ch to join your round and turn your work



Rnd - 3

- sl st into the next space and ch 4
- then go into the next space and place a V stitch (1DC, ch1, 1DC)
- then repeat the following pattern all the way around * (ch 1, DC into the next space then V stitch into the next space)
- at the end of the round, sl st to the top of the 3rd ch and turn your work. You will now have 30 DC in total.

Rnd - 4

- sl st into the ch space and ch 4
- then place 1 DC into the next space, ch 1*
- * Repeat this to the end of the round. (There are no increases in this round.) SI st to the top of the third ch and turn your work

Rnd - 5

*Repeat Rnd 4

Rnd - 6

- sI st into the ch space and ch 4, place 1 DC back into the same space

- ch 1, 1 DC into the next space, ch 1, 1 DC into the next space, ch 1, V st into next space, ch 1*
- * Repeat this to the end of the round. SI st to the top of the 3rd ch to join your round. You will now have 40 DC in total.

Rnd - 7 & 8

Repeat the method in Rnd 4 (No increases here.)

Rnd - 9

- sl st into the ch space and ch 4, place 1 DC, ch1 into each of the two spaces
- ch 1, V st into next space, ch 1
- 1 DC, ch 1 into each of the next 3 spaces, V st into next space, ch 1*
- * Repeat this to the end of the round. SI st to the top of the 3rd ch to join your round. You will now have **50 DC** in total.

Rnd - 10 & 11

Repeat the method in Rnd 4 (No increases here.)

Rnd - 12

- sl st into the ch space and ch 4, place 1 DC back into the same space (V st)
- 1 DC, ch 1 into each of the next 4 spaces, V st into the next space, ch1*
- * Repeat this to the end of the round. SI st to the top of the 3rd ch to join your round. You will now have **60 DC** in total.

Rnd - 13 & 14

Repeat the method in Rnd 4 (No increases here.)

Rnd - 15

- sl st into the ch space and ch 4, place 1 DC, ch 1 into each of the next 4 spaces, V st into the next space, ch1
- ! DC into each of the next 5 spaces, V st into the next space, ch 1*
- * Repeat this to the end of the round. SI st to the top of the 3rd ch to join your round. You will now have **70 DC** in total. (For my size adult this is the last increase round.)

Rnd - 16 - 32

- Repeat the method in Rnd 4 (No increases here.) After Rnd 32, snip your yarn and fasten off.
- ** If you prefer a longer slouchy hat, you may opt to crochet more rounds that stated here.

Hat Brim

Rnd - 33

- SI st to join your yarn into any ch space then ch 1 and place 1 SC back into that same space and ch 1
- Into the next space and every space of the round place 1 SC, ch 1*
- SI st to the top of the first SC to join your round and turn your work.

Rnd 34 - 42

*Repeat Rnd 33

At the end of Rnd 42, snip your yarn and fasten off. Weave in your ends and you are done!
