

## The Crochet Duster Refill

### Crochet Pattern

\*Original pattern designed and written by Karen Moniz of Crochet Crafty © 2021. Enjoy!



Materials	Stitch Legend
- Hook – 8.00 mm	R – row
- Yarn – Bulky weight 5 chenille yarn (as pictured) or you can use medium weight 4 cotton yarn if you wish	st(s) – stitch(es)
* 20-30 grams approx	ch(s) – chains(s)
This design will give you a length of 6 inches or 15cm	sl st – slip stitch
- Scissors	SC – Single crochet
- Yarn needle	* - repeat

### Pattern

Begin with a slip knot on your hook and ch 15 to begin.

#### R – 1

- Into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook, place 1 SC, then continue to place 1 SC into each chain until the end. **You will have 14 stitches in total.**
- Chain 4 and turn your work

#### R – 2

- Into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from your hook, you'll place 1 SC and continue to place 1 SC into the next 2 chains until you come to your first established stitch.
- Then continue to place 1 SC into each st until the end of the row

So we have made R 2 longer than R 1. Therefore you will have a **total of 17 sts** at the end of this row.



- Ch 1 and turn your work

### **R – 3**

- into the very first st, place 1 SC and then continue to insert 1 SC into each st until the end of your row.

- Ch 1 and turn

You will always have 17sts in total for each row from now on.

### **R – 4 --> 14**

\* Repeat row 3

Once you complete R 14, leave a longer tail and snip your yarn. You now have a small panel of fabric. Fold the panel in half so you can find your centre. This is where we will fold the outer edges in to seem into the centre of the fabric to create you narrow pockets for your duster handle to slide into.



\* Remember that Row 1 was the short row so you're tail at the beginning should remind you to make sure to stop sewing once you get to that tail. This will leave a small gap where your handle can nestle into. See pics below.



Once you have sewn the outer edges to your centre, you are ready to use your duster!
