

Scrappy Cap Reversible Beanie Crochet Pattern

Materials	Stitch Legend
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Hook – 5.5 mm - Yarn – Medium weight 4 (approx 100-150g) - Scissors - Yarn needle - measuring tape 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Rnd – round st(s) – stitch(es) ch(s) – chains(s) sl st – slip stitch SC – single crochet DC – double crochet * - repeat

Measurements

You will need to measure the circumference of the head you are making it for. An average adult head size is 22 inches. (This is the size I made in this pattern.) When chaining up your initial foundation chain, it is recommended that you chain one inch less than your measurement as your fabric will stretch. For this particular stitch pattern, you need to make sure that you have an even number of chains. Let's Dive in!



Pattern

Begin with a slip knot on your hook. Chain 70, then sl st to the first ch to create a ring.



Round – 1

- Ch 1, then place 1 SC into the same st, place a DC into the next st *
- Repeat * (1SC into the next st, 1 DC into the next st) until you get to the end of the round
- Slip st to join your round, ch1 and turn your work

You should still have 70 sts

Round – 2

- place 1 SC into the same st you sl st into, then place 1DC into the next st
- repeat this to the end of the round
- Sl st to join your round, ch 1 and turn your work

You will still have 70 sts

Round – 3 through 40 (or however many rnds you need to create the proper hat height for you)

*Repeat Rnd 2

* You should now have a long tube formed.



This should be double the height you would need for your head depth. For example: If you measured 10" from eyebrow to head crown then you will need a total of 20" in length for your "tube".

Now you want to weave a long piece of yarn around one end of your tube and cinch it shut.



Then you want to do the same thing along the other end and cinch it shut. Due to the nature of the project, you may not be able to cinch it completely closed because of the amount of fabric created.

Feel free to use a yarn needle and sew the remaining gap shut.



You will then take one cinched end and push it inward so that it meets the other cinched end and your reversible hat has been formed.☺

Same beanie. Two different sides.
