

Easy Crochet Pocket

Crochet Pattern

Materials Stitch Legend

- Hook - any desired size

(6.5mm was used for pocket pictured)

 Yarn – whichever weight matches your hook size (bulky 5 was used in the above photo)

- Scissors
- Yarn needle

R-Row

st(s) - stitch(es)

ch(s) - chains(s)

Y/O - yarn over

HDC - Half Double Crochet

BLO - back loops only

FBLO - front bottom loop only

DC - Double Crochet

XS - X or crossed stitch

* - repeat

Pattern

Place a slip knot on your hook and ch 23 to begin. (For larger pockets ch in multiples of 3+2)

R - 1

- Into the 4th chain from the hook, place 1 HDC and continue to place 1 HDC into each st to the end of the row. You will have 21 sts in total.
- Ch 2 and turn your work. (The Ch 2 will always count as a HDC.)

R-2


into the next st from the ch 2, place a HDC into the BLO



- continue to place 1 HDC into the BLO of each st to the end of the row.
 You will still have 21 sts in total.
- Ch 2 and turn your work

R - 3

into the next st from the ch 2, place a HDC into the FBLO



- continue to place 1 HDC into the FBLO of each st to the end of the row.
 You will still have 21 sts in total.
- Ch 2 and turn your work

R - 3 -> 12

*Repeat Row 2 & 3 until you reach Row 12

at the end of Row 12, ch 3 and turn your work

R - 13 Adding the X stitch detail

*The X stitch is also known as the Crossed Stitch

 skip two sts from where you last stitched and place a DC, ch 1, go back two sts and place a DC into that st (for this stitch you will insert your hook from behind)



- *repeat until you have 3 sts left
- when you have 3 sts left, place 1 DC into the last st, ch 1
- when you go back to work the crossed over part to create the X, you will be stitching 2 DC together -> go back 2 sts as usual and insert your hook into the stitch to pull up a loop, Y/O and pull through the first two loops but do not finish this DC. You will still have 2 loops on your hook.
- now insert your hook into the last stitch where you already placed a DC and pull up a loop, Y/O
 and pull through the first two loops. You now have 3 loops remaining on your hook. Now Y/O
 and pull through all three loops. You have completed Row 13.
- Ch 3 and turn your work

R - 14 - repeat Row 13.

Voila! Your pocket is complete!

Make sure to leave a nice long tail to sew your pocket to your garment.

Repeat this pattern to create as many pockets as you like.
